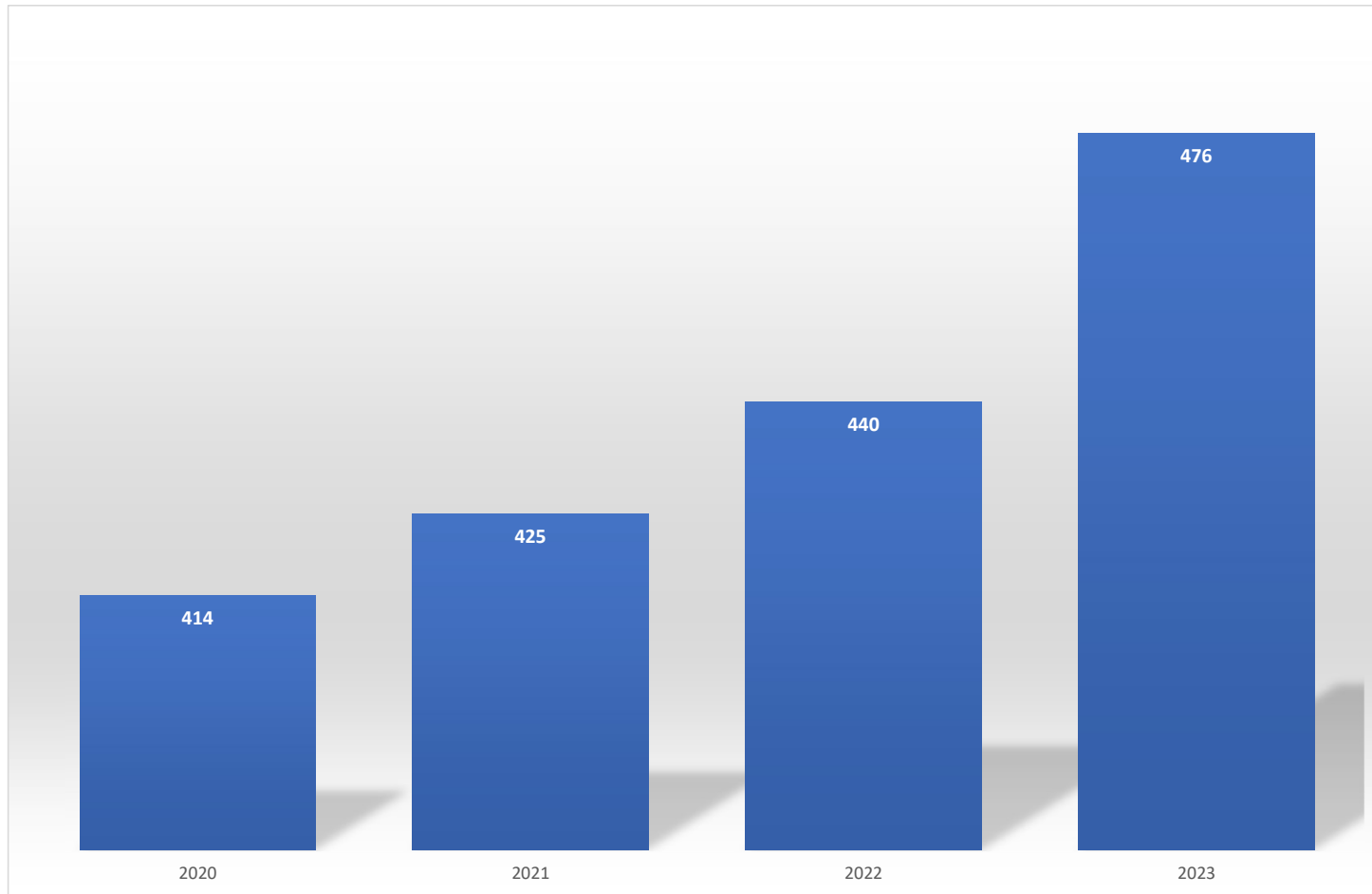

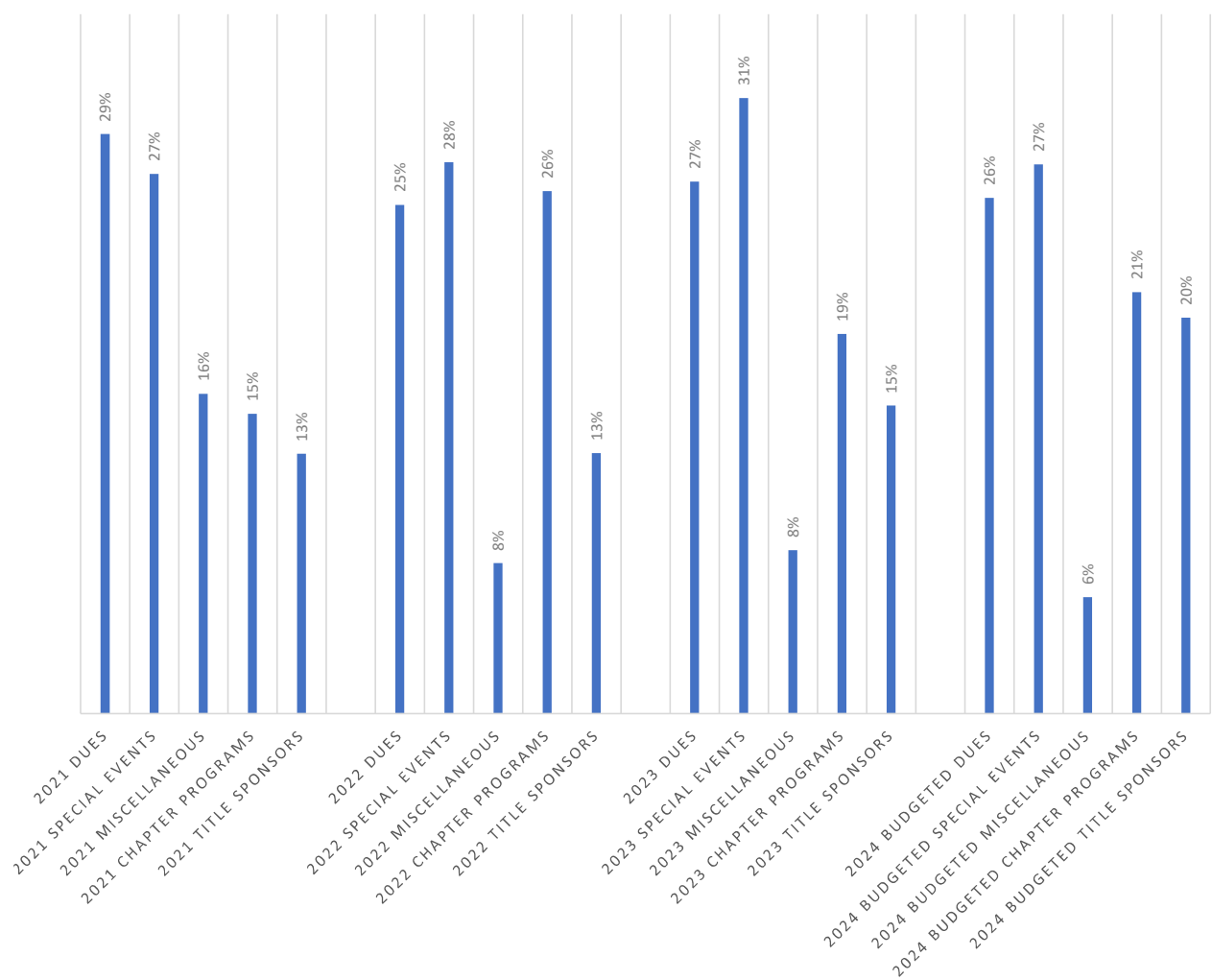

Financial Breakdown: Income and Expenses



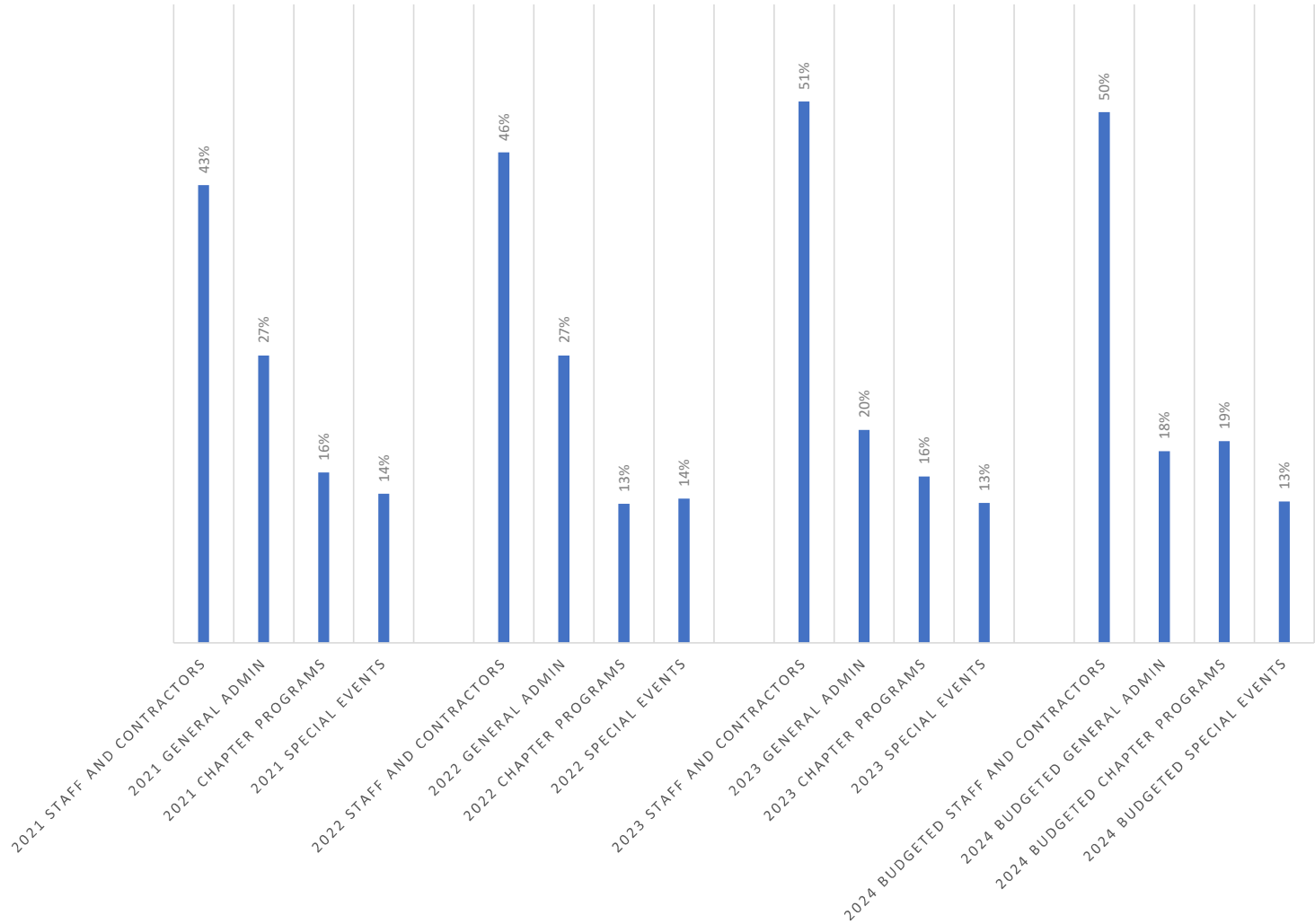

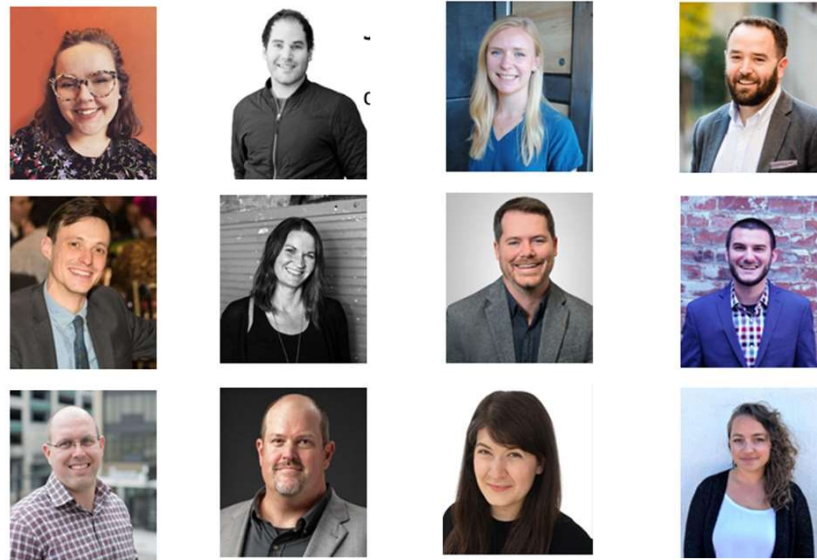

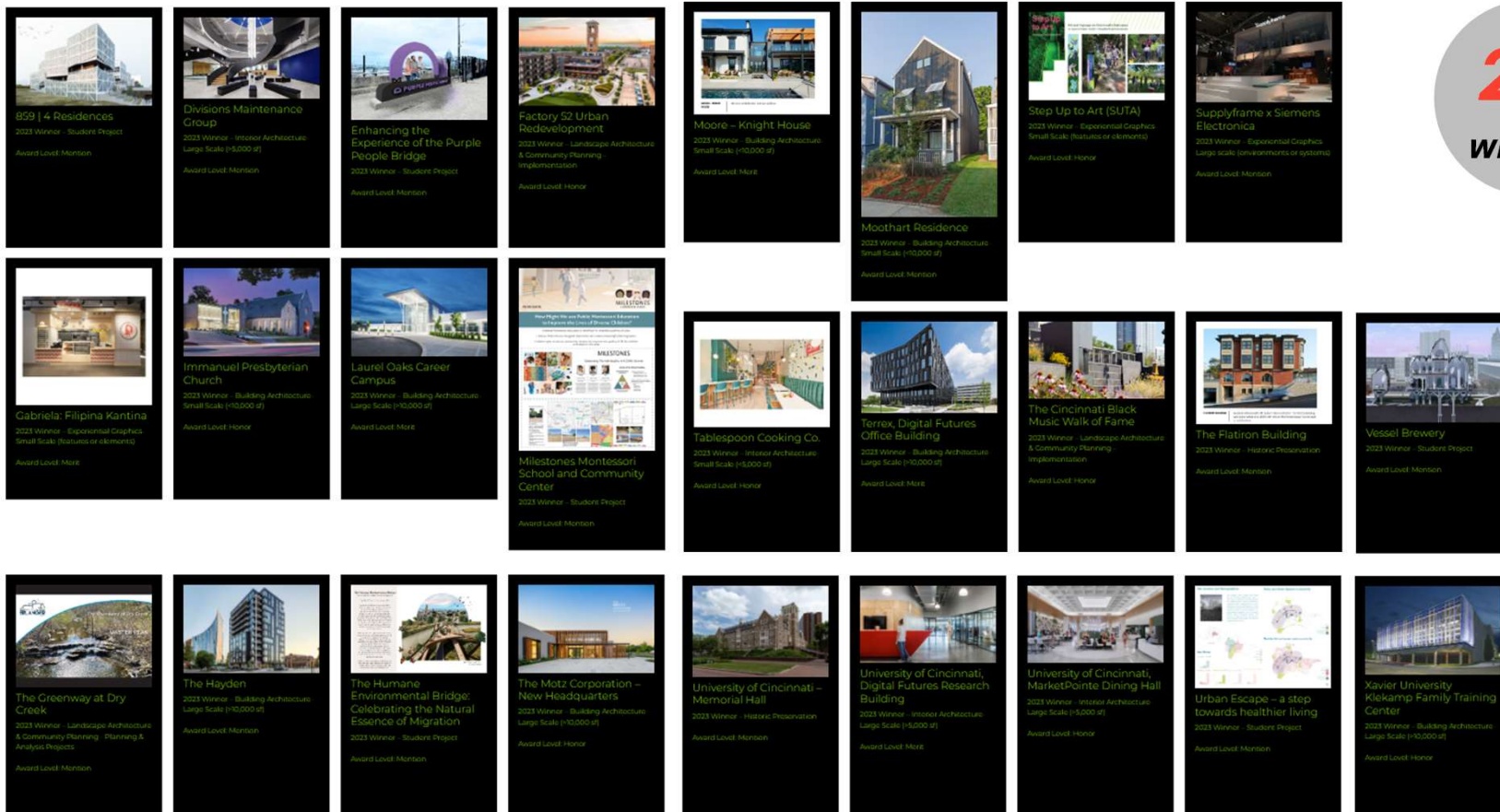
